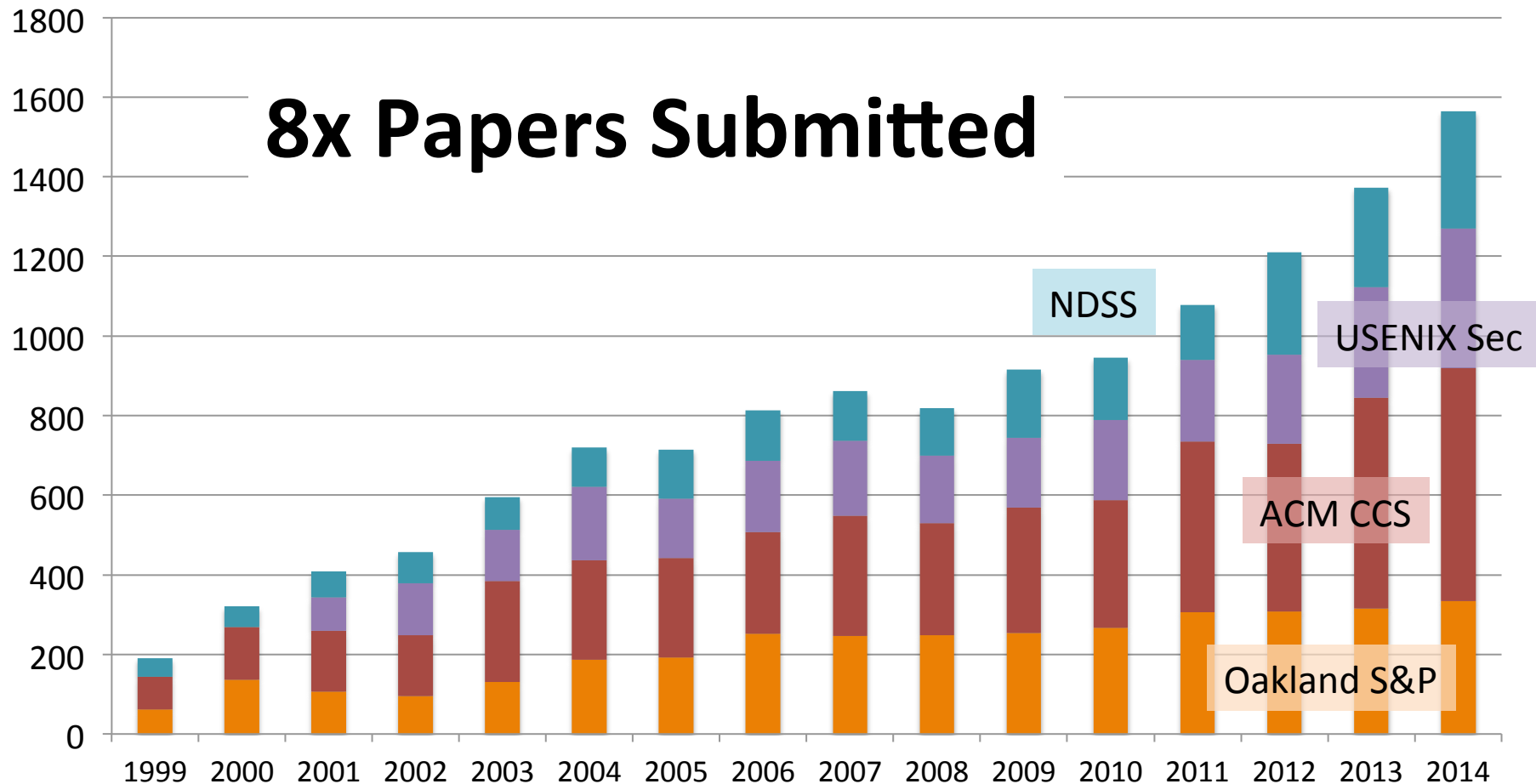

Trends from Previous 15 Years

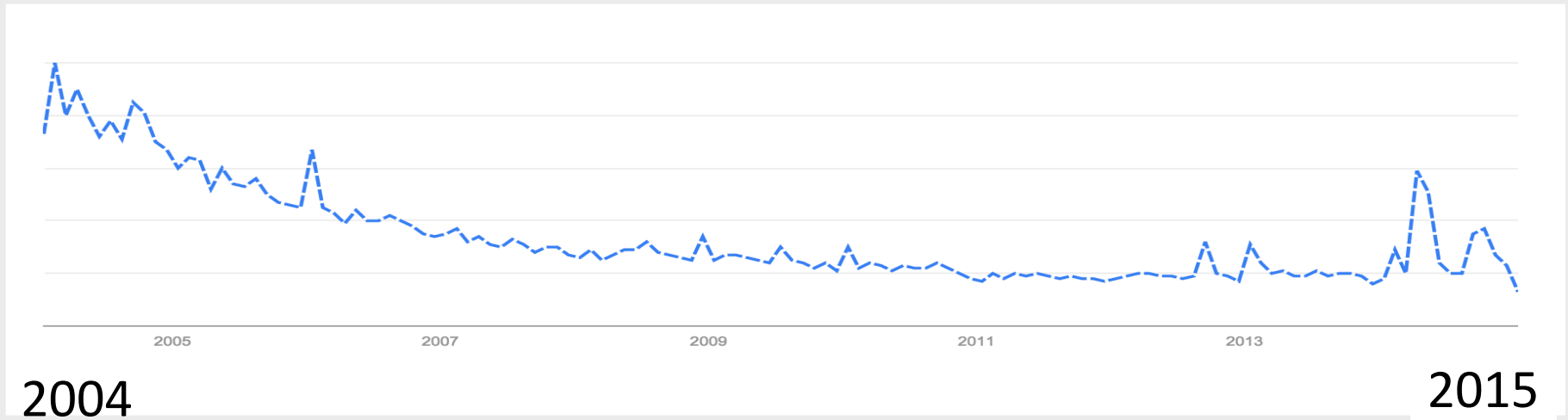

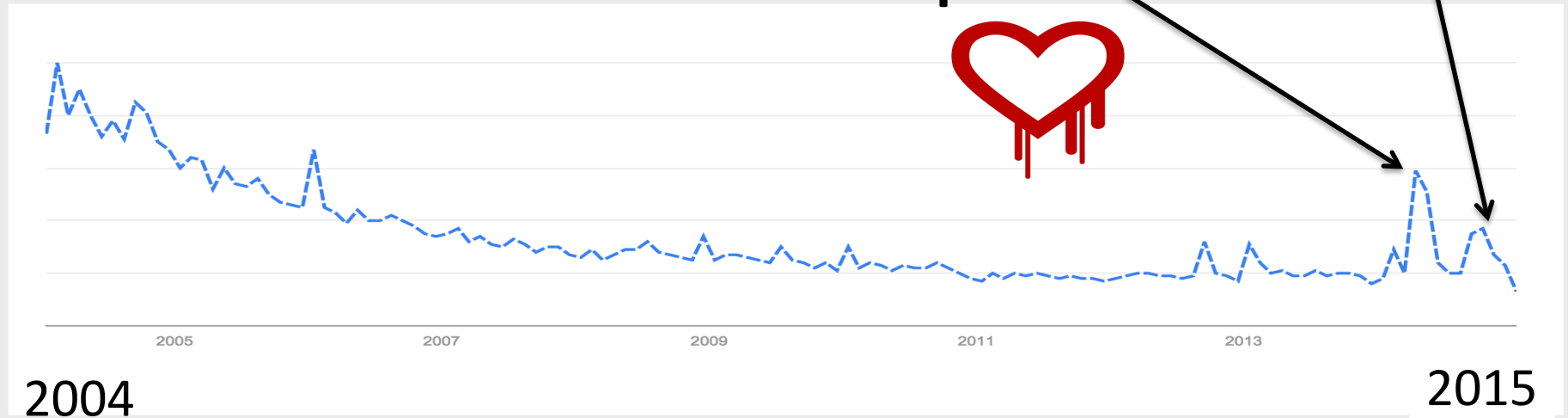
